Part Two: EurAdopt Under Review

Public Statement: EurAdopt Under Review

The crimes committed in Austria do not exist in isolation. Because Austria remains a sitting member of EurAdopt, its corruption and violations spill outward into the wider international adoption network. Families and children across borders are therefore exposed to the same risks of harm and deception, making clear that this is not a national problem but a structural one. The contamination of judgment within Austria is already a contamination of EurAdopt itself.

Evidence has also surfaced connecting Sweden to these same networks. Sweden's current Prime Minister, Ulf Kristersson, formerly chaired Adoptionscentrum (2003–2005), an agency deeply entangled in irregular and exploitative adoption practices, and a member of EurAdopt. State inquiries in Sweden have already confirmed grave abuses, including falsified records and cases where children were even declared "dead" before being funneled abroad. These findings tie directly into EurAdopt, which has long operated under a veil of legitimacy while systemic crimes have been perpetuated beneath its name.

At this time, journalistic review of these links is already underway. Journalists have previously been informed of Sister Nga Thi Tuyet Tran's case in Austria, and now attention is expanding to the wider EurAdopt network, with Sweden's leadership history and documented abuses serving as the entry point for global exposure. The evidence is clear, and the pattern cannot be hidden.

Therefore, EurAdopt stands implicated alongside Austria. Its member nations cannot claim ignorance, for the contamination is systemic, the leadership is entangled, and the review has already begun. The public is hereby alerted: the safety of children and families cannot be entrusted to an organization whose foundations are already crumbling under the weight of Truth.

Update on Liens and Creditors:

As of this date, no payment has been made by the Republic of Austria on the outstanding liens, nor has any effort toward remedy been shown. The civil insurance provider responsible for Austria's public servants has likewise failed to suspend coverage for those acting unlawfully, making it complicit in funding ongoing harm. Because Austria's obligations extend beyond its borders — through international bondholders, Eurobond markets, and institutions such as the World Bank Group and the European Central Bank — creditors are hereby given public notice: the Republic of Austria carries unresolved liens against it, and all connected parties now bear the risk of association. Under both domestic law and international financial conventions, Austria and its insurers were legally and lawfully bound to disclose these liens to all creditors. Their failure to do so constitutes fraudulent concealment, further invalidating their standing and extending liability to every institution still financing them.
